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Mother's Day

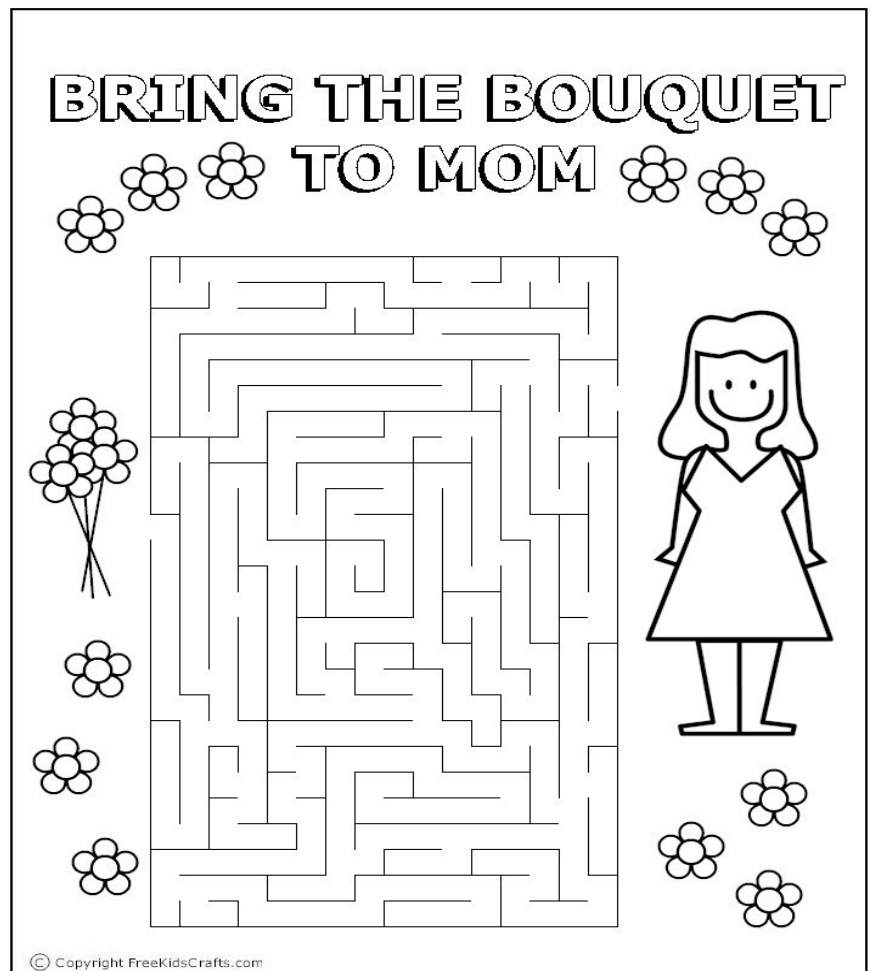

I am the starshine of the night.

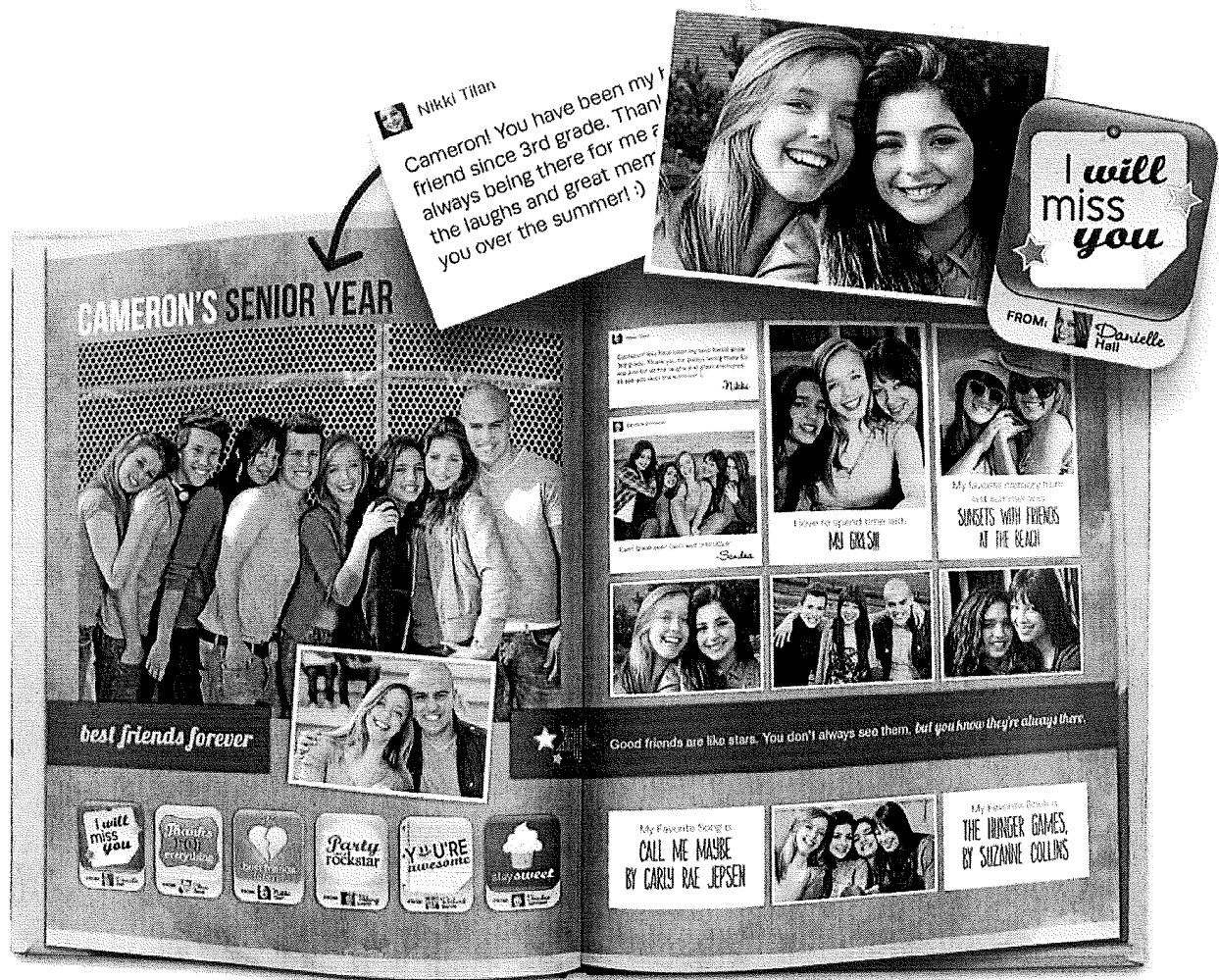

Track:

April 26: At the Bill Bowerman classic track meet in Condon the boys took third place with 81 points. The girls on the other hand dominated the track meet claiming first with 116 points. At the end of the seventh track meet the team has broken 198 personal records.

May 3: At the Arlington track meet our Sherman girls took second with 98 points while our boys did very well and stole first place with 116.5 points. As a whole the team has broken 226 personal records

April 26: In the double header played against Weston McEwen Sherman lost both games 2-5 and 3-4.

May 2: In another double header against Condon wheeler our boys beat them 12-3 and 10-5, Keep it up boys lets go to state this year!

May 6: The boys took on Heppner/lone and won with an amazing ending play and an ending score of 8-7

May 12: Our boys took on The Dalles and suffered a loss, 7-17

May 14: When the boys traveled to Irri-gon to finish up a tied game, they finished the game 5-4 winning a spot in districts.

May 24: In the game against Pilot rock/Nixyaawii Sherman won 5-4, unfortunately Dufur made this a short lived victory beating our boys 1-16.

Tennis:
