The 2019 NICHE Best School Districts Ranking was recently released, factoring state test scores, college readiness, graduation rates, SAT/ACT scores, teacher guality, and public school district ratings. The Sherman County School District was ranked #14 out of 160 Districts in the State of Oregon. In addition, our teaching staff was ranked #6 for the Best Teachers in Oregon and we were ranked the #10 Best Places to Teach in Oregon. 
Middle School Girls


